In 2023, the Miami Township Police Department had set several goals to accomplish. The first goal was to replace one of our expiring operating levies with a new continuous operating levy. The police department relies on two voter approved levies to fund the police department's yearly operating costs. In May, the residents of Miami Township supported the police department and passed the levy giving the police department a stable source of funding.

The second goal was to continue developing our community outreach programs and strengthen our relationship with our community. During 2023, the police department participated in community outreach programs like, Shop with a Hero, Coffee with a Cop, Trunk or Treat, Easter and Christmas celebrations at Austin Landing and our flagship National Night Out program earned a 4th place finish among all other National Night Out programs in the nation.

Our third goal was to improve our police officer recruitment efforts. To accomplish this, the department implemented a recruitment team, joined the National Testing Network, and used the Indeed job website to expand our recruiting areas to target candidates outside the state of Ohio. This helped recruit several experienced officers to join our department.

Finally, the police department continued to find ways to save tax-payers money by using federal and state grant opportunities to help off-set the costs of officer training and for purchasing new equipment. As the department moves forward, we will continue to leverage modern technology to be more efficient in our efforts to keep the citizens of Miami Township safe.

The members of the Miami Township Police Department are dedicated to keeping the citizens and visitors of Miami Township safe and this is why I am honored to carry the title of Chief of Police of this fine agency.

ORGANIZATION CHART

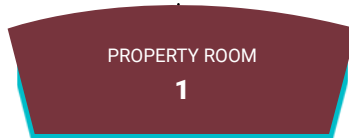
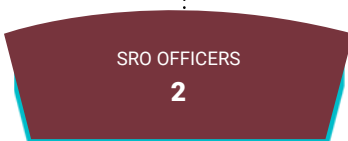
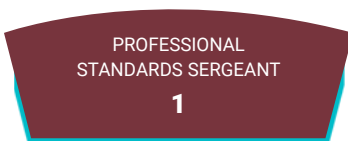
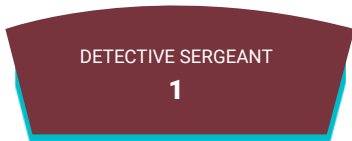
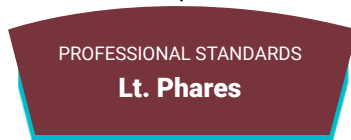
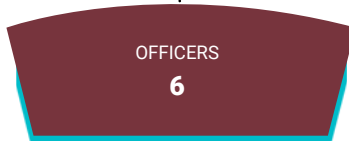
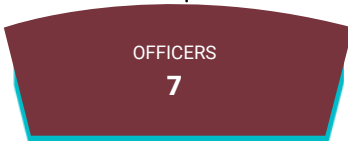
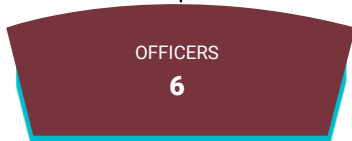
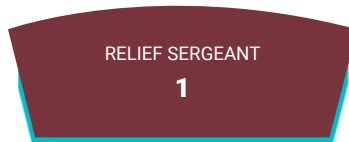
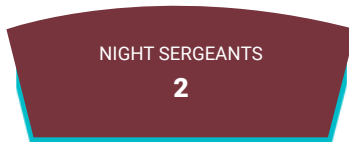
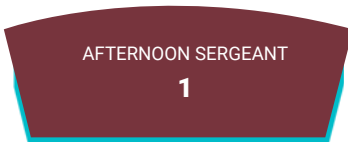
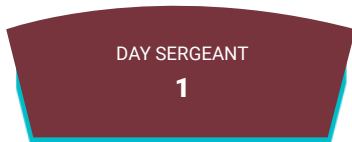
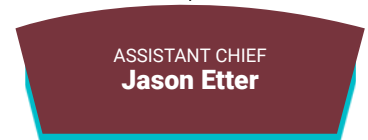

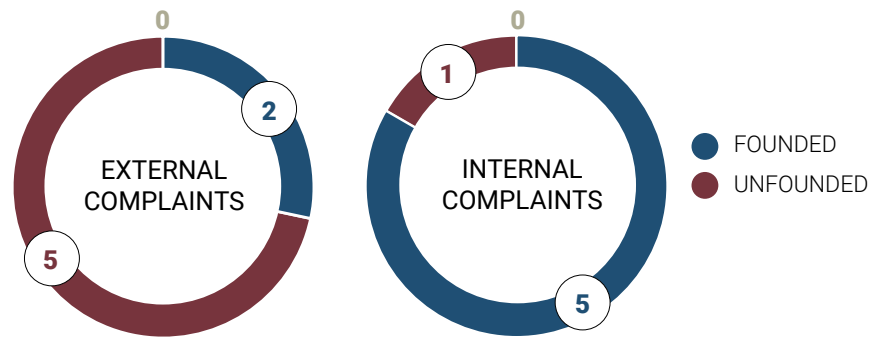
PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

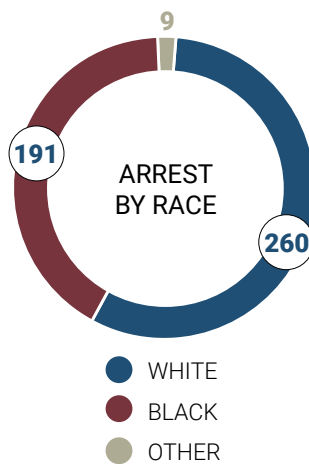
2023 USE OF FORCE STATISTICS



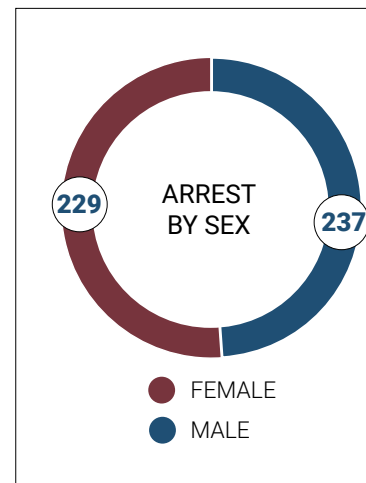
2023 COMPLAINT



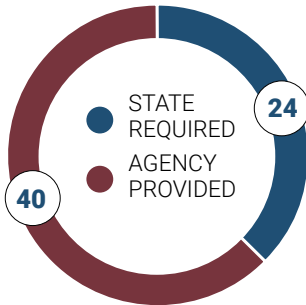
ARRESTS BY RACE

OFFICER TRAINING HOUR STATISTICS



In 2023, every sworn officer of the Miami Township Police Department was mandated by the State of Ohio to complete 24 hours of in-service training for Legal Updates, Arrest, Search and Seizure, and School Threat Assessment. In addition to the state mandated training, we required our officers to complete an additional 40 hours of training for Firearms, Less Lethal force, and Critical Incident Training for mental health crisis response.

Last year, the department increased the number of drone operators to (5) certified operators and these operators used our drones 77 times.



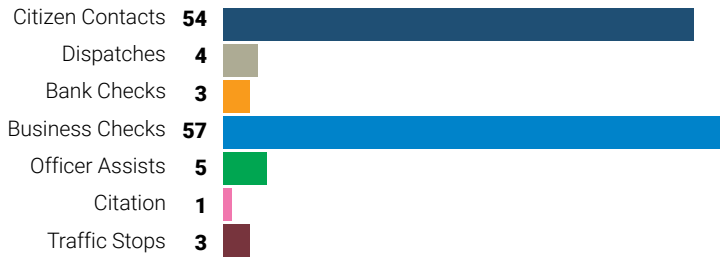


BIKE CONTROL
